What are the tour timings?

Where is the meeting point?

St Aldates Police Station, Oxford OX1 1SZ is the meeting point, and we will be there from 10.40am.


Please plan your travel to be at the meeting point from 10.30am.

The tour will commence promptly at 11am.

How do I get to St Aldates Police Station?


We recommend the following travel options:

- By Train to Oxford Station, and a short walk the St Aldates
- By the City's Park and Ride Scheme, Stops P1, P2, S1 and S2 are all close to St Aldates Police Station



How do I use the Park and Ride?

The City operates a Park and Ride scheme. The map below shows the car parks that are available for visitors to Oxford City Centre.



Example: if travelling from London using the M40 motorway, take junction 8 and follow the signs to the Park and Ride. There you park your car in the car park and use the city bus to travel to St Aldates.

How much does the park and ride cost?

You must pay (A) to park your car, and (B) to use the Bus to Oxford City Centre and back to the Car Park. Buses run every 10/12/15 minutes from the different Park and Ride site, and I would allow 20-25 minutes (inclusive of the bus journey) to reach St Aldates from a Park & Ride car park.

Parking costs approx. £5, and a Same Day Return Bus ticket is £2.80. Family tickets are also available.

Please plan your journey beforehand and buy the right tickets for you and your group.

The bus drivers are also very helpful to visitors, and if you have parked your car and paid the car parking fare, you can pay for your bus tickets via contactless on the bus.

Other Parking Options include parking in the Shopping Centre in central Oxford – but it will be more expensive, and traffic in Oxford City Centre can be busy
