Outline of the Oxford City Walking Tour.

The walking tour in Oxford City Centre will visit Oxford colleges associated with:

- Institutions in Oxford associated with the British Raj
- Sikhs who studied at Oxford University in the late 19th and 20th century
- Key individuals associated with Oxford and who were prominent figures in the British Raj

How long does each tour last, and how much walking is involved?

We have planned a 3 hour walking tour with breaks, covering 4 Oxford Colleges, institutions and a museum. At the end of the tour, you are free to continue your afternoon in central Oxford.

What are the tour timings?

The tour will commence at 11am sharp and we will finish by 2/2.30pm.

Where is the meeting point?

St Aldates Police Station, Oxford OX1 1SZ is the meeting point, and we will be there from 10.40am.

Please plan your travel to be at the meeting point from 10.30am.

The tour will commence promptly at 11am.

Who are the team leading the tour?
