What's the Sikh link with this exhibition?

Well, not a lot really. The Royal Collection does indeed include lots of items from Punjab and North India, but none of those are included in this exhibition. There is a section in the exhibition on the Prince of Wales, later King Edward VII, who visited India in 1875-76, and the Delhi Durbar Coronation of 1911, and a number of items from India are included in the display.

A little History of the Sikhs has been invited to have 3 Community Days for our groups at the Gallery during this exhibition, based on the Heritage Days we run at Hampton Court Palace.

We plan to provide a short talk on the Sikhs during the Edwardian Age (1902 – 1919) and invited our audiences to have community group access to the Exhibition at the King's Gallery, within Buckingham Palace. For nearly all, this may be a first visit to The King's Gallery within Buckingham Palace.

The Royal Collection Trust aims to help as many people as possible to access and enjoy the art, architecture and history of the Royal Palaces. A little History of the Sikhs is now a registered community organisation, enabling our group to engage with art and history.

How do I get to the King's Gallery by Public Transport?

By underground: The nearest tube stations are Victoria, Green Park, St. James's Park and Hyde Park Corner (all approximately 10 minutes walk).

The nearest train stations are London Victoria (10 minute walk) or London Charing Cross (20 minute walk).

Bus numbers 11, 211, C1 and C10 stop on Buckingham Palace Road.

Eating & Drinking at The King's Gallery – the rules!

Eating and drinking are not permitted inside The King's Gallery, except for bottled water. You will be asked to place drinks and food in closed bags before being admitted. Food and drink are not available for purchase at the Gallery, but there are many cafés and restaurants in the local area.

Can we go inside Buckingham Palace on the day?

Ummm, No. The event takes place at The King's Galleries and is not a ticket or entry for Buckingham Palace or the Royal Mews. If you would like to visit Buckingham Palace or the Royal Mews, you will need to make a separate booking for the period 10 July - 28 September 2025.

Other Information.

- When you arrive, you will pass through an airport-style security check.
- You can take photographs in the Gallery.
- Eating and drinking are not allowed inside the Gallery.
- Toilets and baby-care facilities are available.
- Pushchairs can be taken into the Gallery
